### **SAMPLE STORY**

#### **Four Legged Creatures in the Villas**

Having lived in Silver Springs for many years we rarely saw much wildlife, save for the odd snowshoe hare or skunk. That changed dramatically when we moved to the Villas in 2013. Early one February morning, in our first year here, we turned on the kitchen light and, in the dim morning light, were greeted by two huge moose staring at us as we poured our morning coffee. They even seemed to respond to our voices, as we looked on, spellbound. We felt as if we were nose to nose with them, only two thin panes of glass separating us. They continued exploring our backyard, looking for a way out. The snow on the steep backyard made the hill too slippery to try jumping the fence so they continued eastward in search of a better escape route. A while later we saw them trotting back down our front street, with the hope of, perhaps, stumbling on the footprints they'd made where they entered our property. They eventually made their way back to Rocky Ridge Drive but found it no easier to navigate than our Villas.

There were even more fences to block their movement! Fish and Wildlife officers met them along the Drive, tranquilized them and hauled them away in the first part of a catch-and-release operation. The moose pair gained celebrity status by making it onto the 6 o'clock television news that fateful day. In our time living here we have seen not only moose but bobcats, coyotes, hares, domestic rabbits, a muskrat, and a skunk.
